## The Business Case for Breastfeeding Summit

Your organization has been selected as one of 20 key business and union groups invited to join the U.S. Surgeon General, Dr. Regina Benjamin, U.S. Senator Jeff Merkley, and staff from HHS and the U.S. Department of Labor to hear your challenges and solutions to implementing the law, and to network with other national organizations. This summit will address:

- Technical assistance needs for business organizations and its members;
- Solutions that address the barriers to implementing the law (business leaders);
- Guidelines for implementing the law (Department of Labor and Littler law firm); and
- Evidence-based resources and tools to assist with implementation.

As you may be aware, the lactation accommodation provisions, which became law on March 23, 2010, require businesses to provide reasonable time and a private space, other than a bathroom, for employees to express milk at work. According to the 2010 Employee Benefits Survey published by the Society for Human Resource Management, 28% of businesses are currently providing lactation rooms and less than 50% provide flexible break options for breastfeeding women. The summit will focus on innovative solutions to help increase compliance.

As we work toward widespread implementation of the law, your input on successful strategies will be invaluable.
